The Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO)

- A specialized agency of the United Nations that leads international efforts to defeat hunger.
- In the Pacific, the FAO Sub-regional Office for the Pacific is located in Apia.
- FAO members (Pacific/Oceania): Cook Islands, Fiji, Kiribati, Marshall Islands, Federated States of Micronesia, Nauru, Niue, Palau, Samoa, Solomon Islands, Tonga, Tuvalu, Vanuatu, Papua New Guinea, New Zealand, Australia (Associate member: Tokelau).





The 2022 International Year of Artisanal Fisheries and Aquaculture (IYAFA) highlighted the vital contributions of small-scale fisheries in supporting equitable, resilient and sustainable food systems and promoted a global wave to amplify the voices of small-scale fishers, and enhance global awareness, understanding and action.





SSF Summit 2022

- The 1st SSF Summit was held on 02nd-04th September 2022 in Rome, Italy.
- Aimed to promote dialogue between small-scale fisheries actors, key partners and decision-makers, just prior to the 35th Committee of Fisheries (COFI) meeting.
- >140 participants from > 40 countries joined.

SSF Guidelines

- The Voluntary Guidelines for Securing Sustainable Small-Scale Fisheries in the Context of Food Security and Poverty Eradication (SSF Guidelines).
- A negotiated international instrument entirely dedicated to small-scale fisheries and is grounded on human rights principles.
- Complements other international instruments and has synergies with regional instruments.



So what happened Next?

The 35th Session of the Committee of Fisheries (COFI) was held from the 05th-09th September 2022:

- highlighted the unique opportunity to gather commitments and recommendations at a Summit on small-scale fisheries.
- encouraged that the SSF Summit be held every 2 years prior to COFI, subject to resourcing, to sustain and inform further support.

COFI is an Inter-governmental global forum where FAO members meet to review and consider issues related to fisheries and aquaculture. The 36th COFI is sheduled for 8-12 July 2024.

Committee on Fisheries (COFI)

• A subsidiary body of the FAO Council, established in 1965.



Sailing to the SSF Summit 2024



Planning for 2nd SSF Summit need to ensure a participatory and transparent planning process. Thus, in the participatory spirit of the SSF Guidelines, a Concept note for engagement was developed for a collective planning process for the next Summit in 2024.

SSF Summit 2024: Concept note for engagement

• Questions under 5 main sections:



What do we know so far?

- Dates: 5-7 July 2024, just prior to COFI 36.
- Location: Rome, Italy.
- Participation approach: Staged approach, with at least the first day reserved for small-scale fisheries actors and movements only.

Agenda progress:

- Concept note and agenda under development
- IPC, ICSF, CAOPA Day 1 and agenda advice for small-scale fishers (initial stage)
- Save the date announcement planned tentatively for 21 November, including call for expressions of interest to participate

Proposed objectives:

- a) To sustain and inform continued support to small-scale fishers and fish workers for the implementation of SSF Guidelines.
- b) To offer a space for key SSF actors at national, regional and global level to:
 - i. Collectively plan and advise
 - ii. Get to know each other
 - iii. Share and learn
- c) To support, where possible, the Global Strategic Framework in Support of the Implementation of the SSF Guidelines, as a partnership mechanism, where possible. This partnership mechanism intends to give SSF actors, government and other stakeholders a space to collaborate at the global level.

Proposed Expected outcomes

- a) Strengthened small-scale fishers and fish workers and their affiliated organizations
- b) Improved communication between small-scale fisheries organizations themselves, and between these organizations and other key partners implementing the SSF Guidelines
- c) All actors better prepared to contribute to the implementation of the SSF Guidelines, in line with their guiding principles and respectful of the rights of small-scale fishers

Proposed SSF Summit format

- The SSF Summit 2022 took place over the course of three days, using a phased approach that first provided a secure space for small-scale fisheries actors and social movements, and then opened up to other stakeholders.
- It is proposed that the next Summit will follow the same approach:
 - Day 1 (by invitation only for small-scale fishers, fish workers, their organizations and social movements)
 - Day 2 (open to other key partners)
 - Day 3 (open to other key partners)
- It was also noted that the next Summit needs to provide space for dialogue rather than too many presentations.

SSF Summit format

Questions for 03rd CBFD Members:

- What elements or formats would you like to see at a future SSF Summit?
- The SSF Summit 2022 took a staged approach, with one day dedicated entirely to small-scale fisheries actors only, followed by two days of sessions with other actors. Is this a useful approach?
- How long should the SSF Summit be?

Possible Agenda Items? The 1st SSF Summit covered a number of relevant thematic areas but there is still room for improvement to ensure future SSF Summits inform the implementation of the SSF Guidelines in a participatory manner, grounded in a human-rights based approach. In celebrating the 10th anniversary of the SSF Guidelines in 2024, key topics of interest proposed could include:

- SSF governance of tenure and sustainable resource management
- Disaster risks and climate change
- Social protection and development
- Value-chains
- Gender and youth as cross-cutting themes

Proposed Participation

The 1st SSF Summit created a space where small scale fisheries actors themselves could interact, complementing existing spaces where they have less direct voice, such as COFI.

For the 2nd SSFt Summit, it is proposed that SSF actors are the primary participants (i.e., small-scale fishers and fish workers, their organizations and social movements), ensuring geographical balance. Other SSF partners and supporters, and more Governments should also attend.

The 2nd SSF Summit es expected to take place in July 2024.


