Technical Assistance

- Drafts of 16 management plans and 15 regulations progressed in 12 PICTs, since 2022
- Focus areas include:
 - coastal fisheries management measures (e.g. size limits, quotas, gear limitations, licensing, reporting)
 - fish aggregating devices
 - community-based fisheries management
 - penalties for violations









Technical Assistance


- Development or review of management & development plans, strategies and policies
- Development or review of laws, regulations and local by-laws
- Provision of advice to members on specific measures and issues
 - Size limits, quotas, Law of the Sea, CBFM, offences, penalties, enforcement powers





Training Opportunities

- 136 PICTs government officers trained in various aspects of coastal fisheries policy or legislation since 2022:
 - How to write a management plan
 - How to draft legislation
 - How to read legislation for enforcement


- In-country and virtual training on preparing fisheries policies and management plans





REEFLEX information by species, type of measure or PICT









