#### Climate Justice

Recognizing that Global warming/climate change affects everyone, but Small Island Development States (SIDS), including PICTs, are more severely affected than others. SIDS are of the least responsible for creating the problems.

#### Grassroot initiatives for Climate Justice.

- Grassroot lead projects, campaigns or actions that aim to address climate change and promote climate justice.
- Involves local communities, organizations and individuals who are actively working at the grassroot level to mitigate the impacts of climate change, advocate for equitable solutions and empower local communities.

# Role of Local Communities in Driving Change

- Involves examining the contributions, challenges and potential of local communities in initiating and implementing positive transformations within their own environment.
- Key aspects includes;
- Empowerment and Ownership
- Capacity Building
- Collaboration and Networking
- Advocacy

# Example of Grassroot initiatives and community engagement

Youth groups, NGOs and Civil Societies are very active in the Pacific. Supports grassroot initiatives on climate change. Includes;

- Tokelau Climate Warriors
- Tuvalu National Youth Council
- Youth Climate Action Network (YCAN)
- Pacific Islands Climate Action Network (PICAN)

Government programmes –community based fisheries management programmes, coral replanting, stock restocking, farming, fish reserves.

#### Guardians.

- An experiential environmental awareness programme designed to improve environmental literacy of year 7 and 8 classes in primary schools enhancing community resilience to the impacts of climate change.

### Guardians

- Co-developed by NGO's, Youth Groups and Government entities.
- Build community
  awareness on the
  environment and impacts
  of climate change.
- 5 training modules, wastes, corals, fisheries, trees and voyaging.
- Target year 7-8 students.



### Corals

- Look at coral polyps and coral reefs.
- Factors that threatens corals survival,
- Habitats for fish and invertebrates
- Need to conserve and protect corals



### Wise Fisher

- Understanding of food web and ecological pyramid
- Basic principles and approaches to fisheries management.
- Impacts of unregulated fishing.
- Type of destructive fishing and impacts.



# Challenges and Opportunities

- Resources, project funded,
- Many players doing the same thing, causes confusion.
- Community leadership and governances changes overtime,- different level of commitment
- Ownership and IP of project outputs and results relates to donor requirements
- Opportunity to collaborate and networking with partners and donors
- Opportunity to review govt. policies
- Sharing of knowledge and resources
- Availability of base line data
