(i) ADB provides partner countries with indicative budget allocations as part of its annual country operations business plan process. Each developing member country's operations program is annually formulated as an indicative 3-year rolling country operations business plan (COBP) that is consistent with the relevant country partnership strategy (CPS) or regional strategy. The CPS (or relevant regional strategy) is the primary planning instrument guiding ADB's operations in a developing member country as well as the monitoring and evaluation tool to track performance over the CPS period. The CPS identifies the agreed priority areas where ADB can provide support in a most responsive, relevant, and result-oriented manner in achieving the country's development strategy and poverty reduction goals, in consultation with the government, development partners, and other stakeholders. It explains the country specific development context, the rationale for selection of ADB activities, links to other development partners, and implementation and monitoring process.

(ii) The regional category primarily covers technical assistance provided in support of regional projects and to activities executed by regional organizations.

(iv) Solomon Islands - Economic Recovery Support Program \$5 million
