


Electronic Monitoring (Longline) Technical Standard Workshop

Purpose: The purpose of the workshop is to develop a draft EM 'how' standard (where how means transferring EM records to EM data). The output will be a paper for general discussion at the WCPFC EREM WG2 in August 2016.

- Data-field by data-field review of key issues for longline, including:
 - o In general terms, HOW the data are collected:
 - (i) Pre-trip through authorised inspection
 - (ii) Generated by the EM equipment/hardware only (i.e. without human intervention)
 - (iii) Recorded by office observer through analysis of EM video/imagery post-trip
 - o If the transferring of EM records to EM data is practical now or needs further development
 - o Specific 'record' to 'data' instructions process for setting standards, and
 - Consideration of any ideas for EM-generated data that are not possible now but worthy of pursuing
