Chart 1: Total Population by Gender

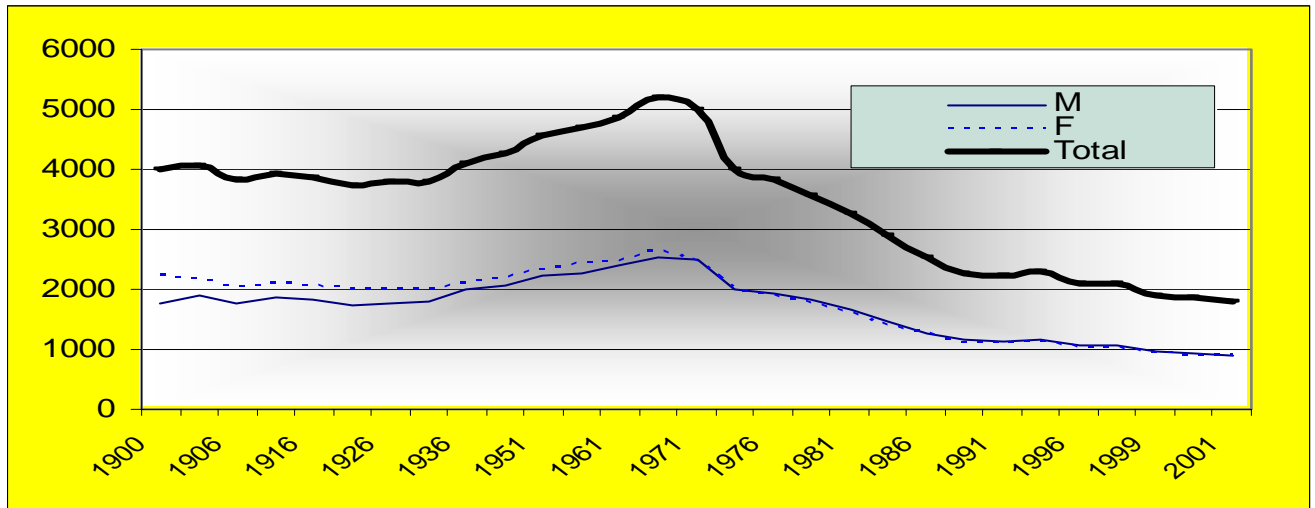


Chart 2: Population Growth, 1900 – 2001

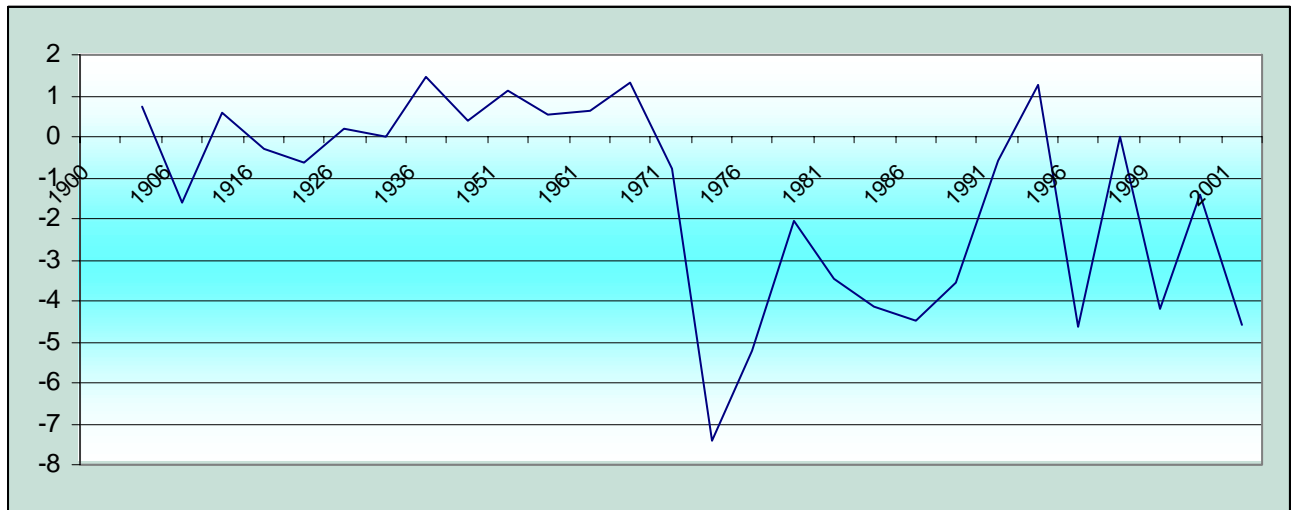


Chart 3: Population Growth by Gender, 1900 – 2001

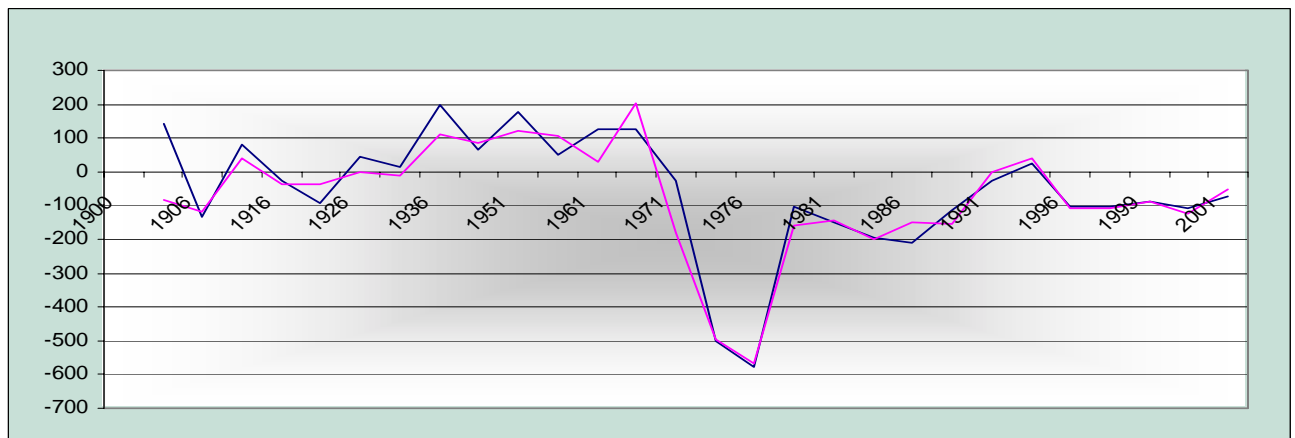
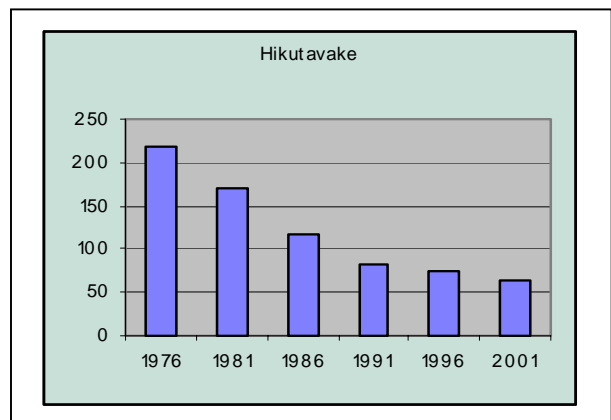
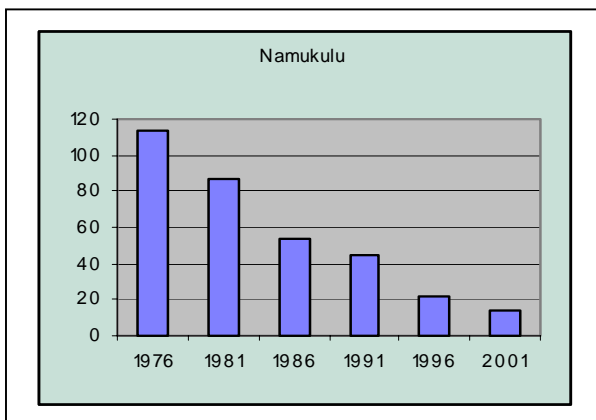
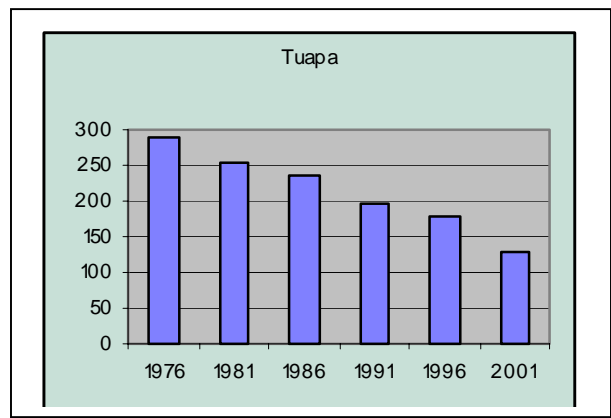
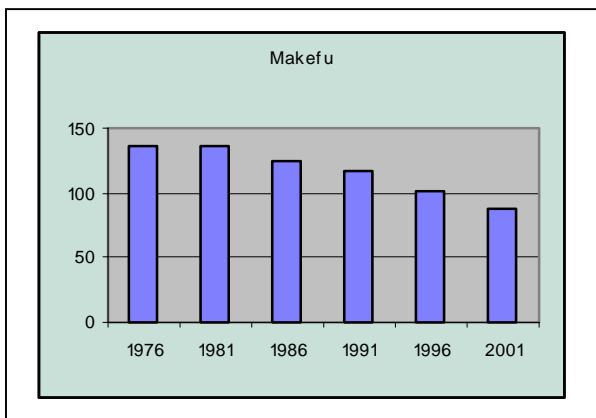
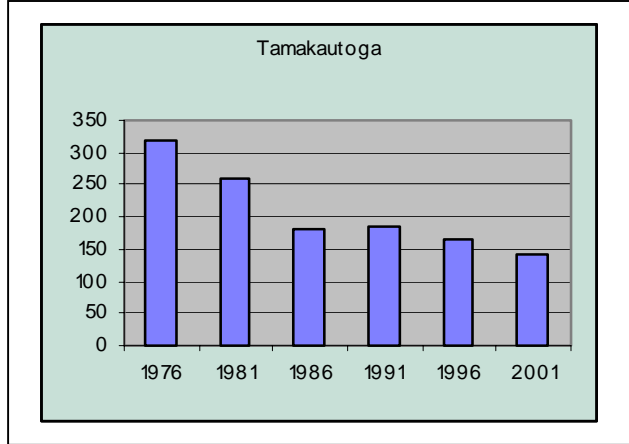
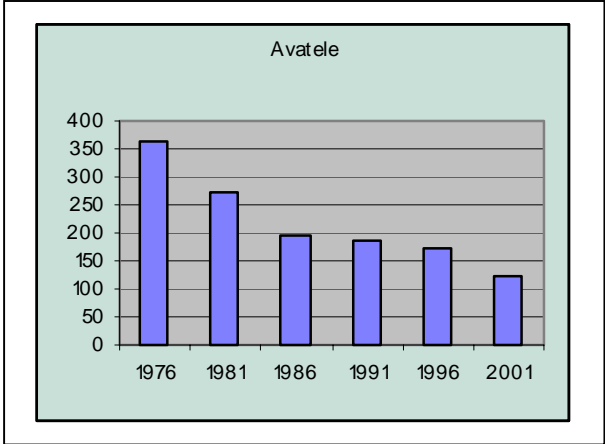
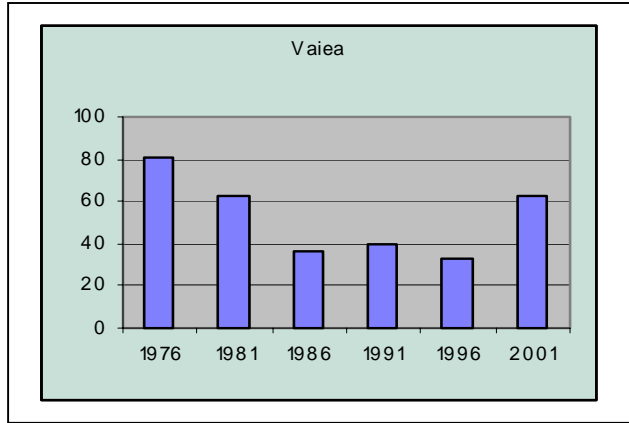
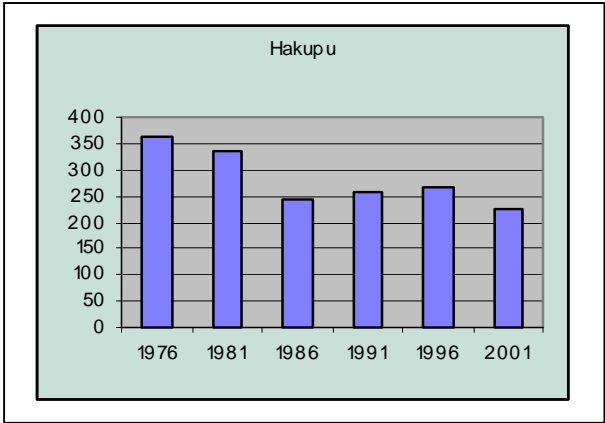
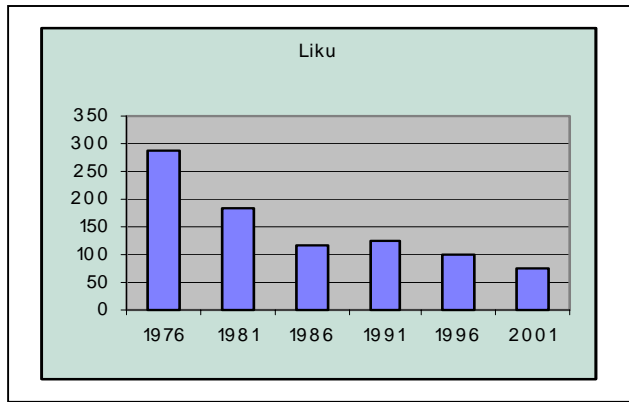
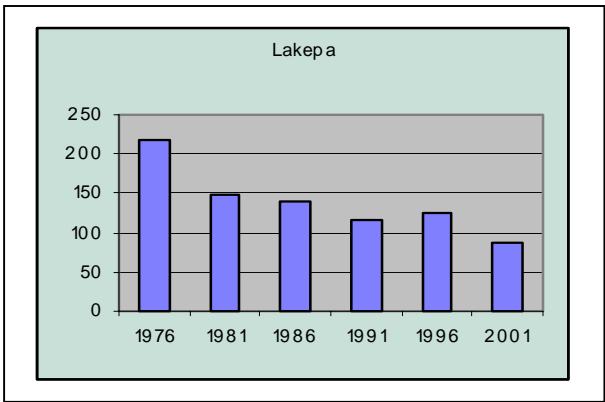
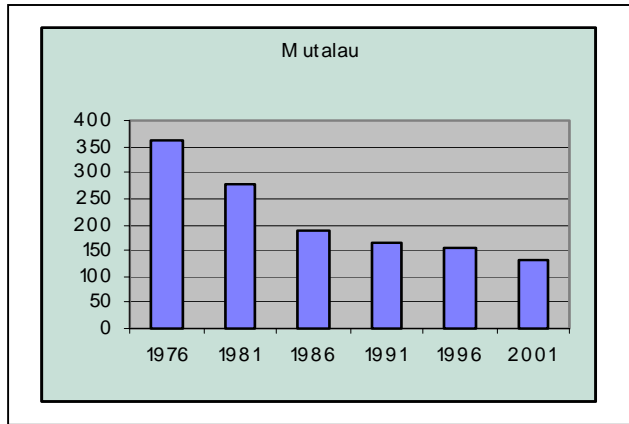
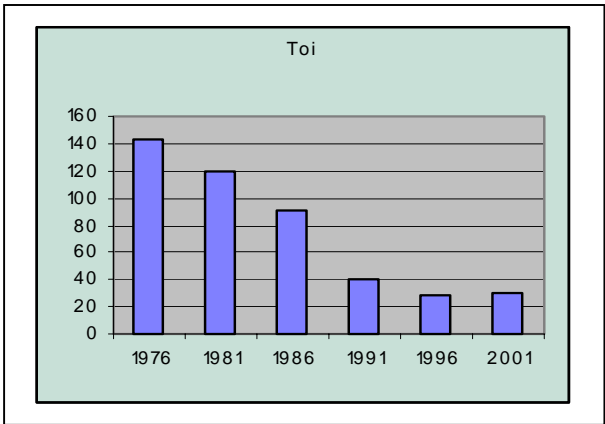

Chart 4: Village Population, 1976 – 2001 (5 Yrs)





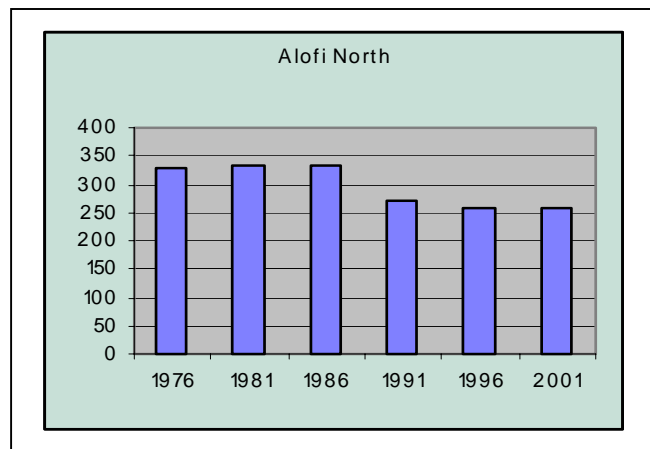
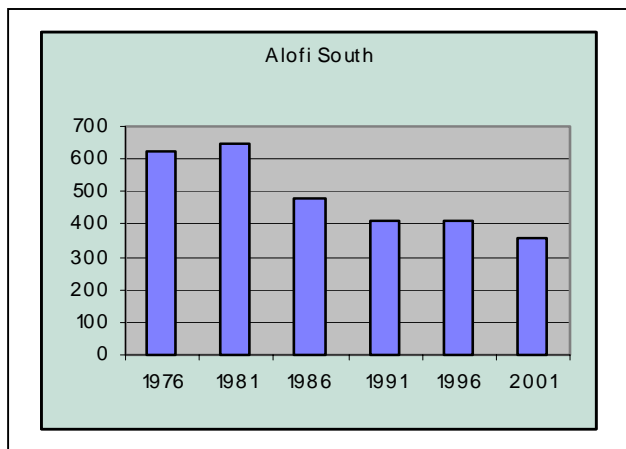

Chart 5: Rates of Birth, Death and Natural Increases 1970 - 2001

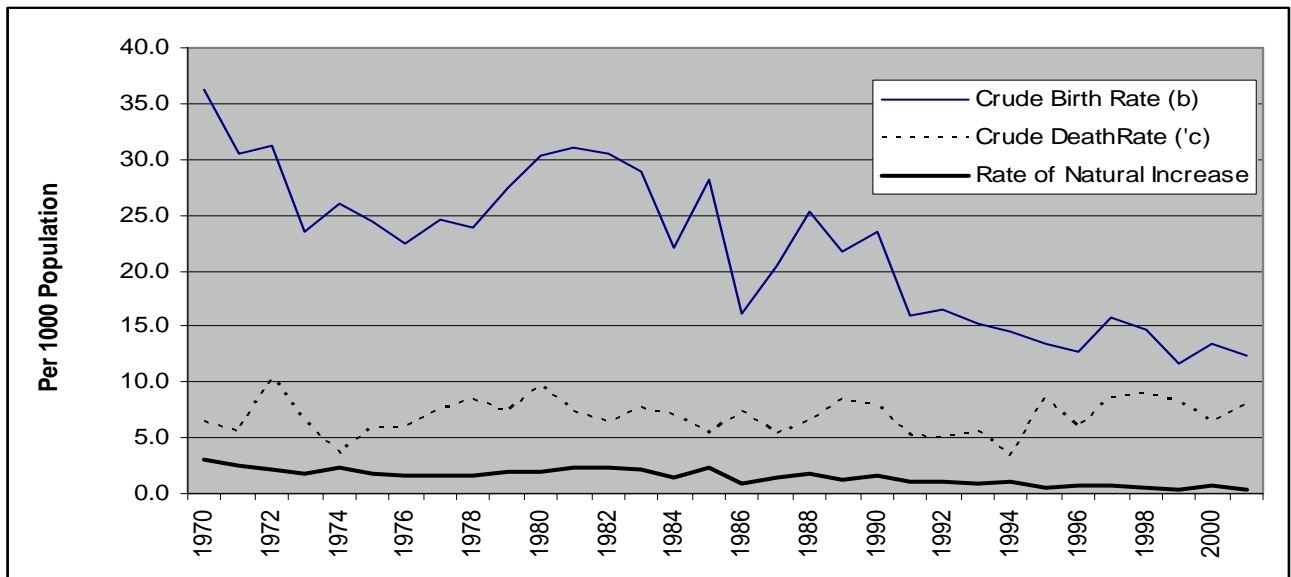

Chart 6: Overseas Migration 1988 - 2002

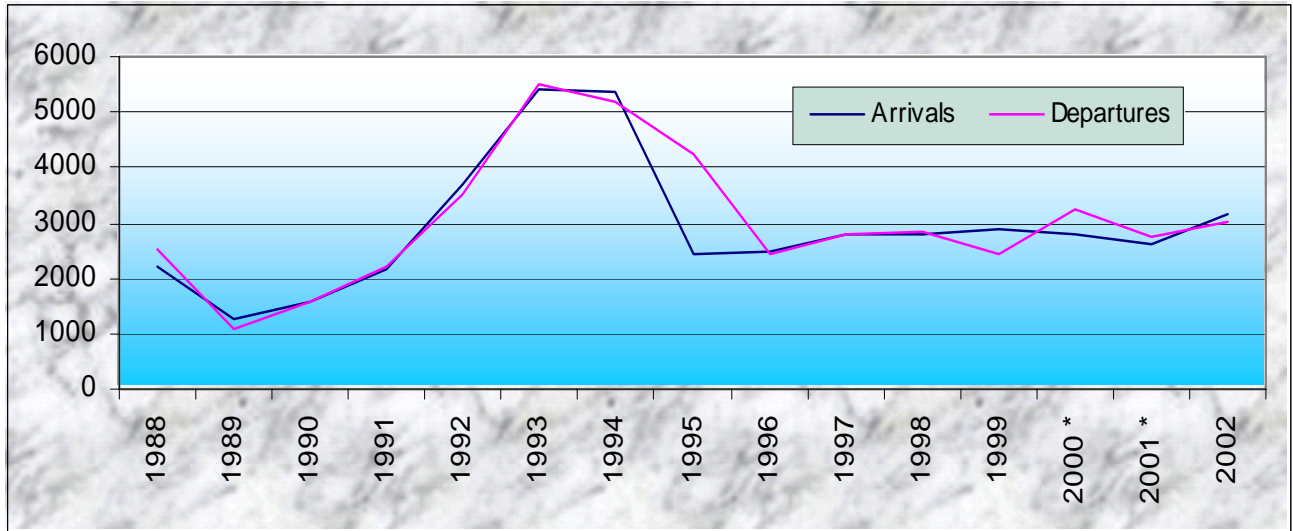

Chart 7 : Arrivals by Year and Purpose of Visit, 1988 - 2002

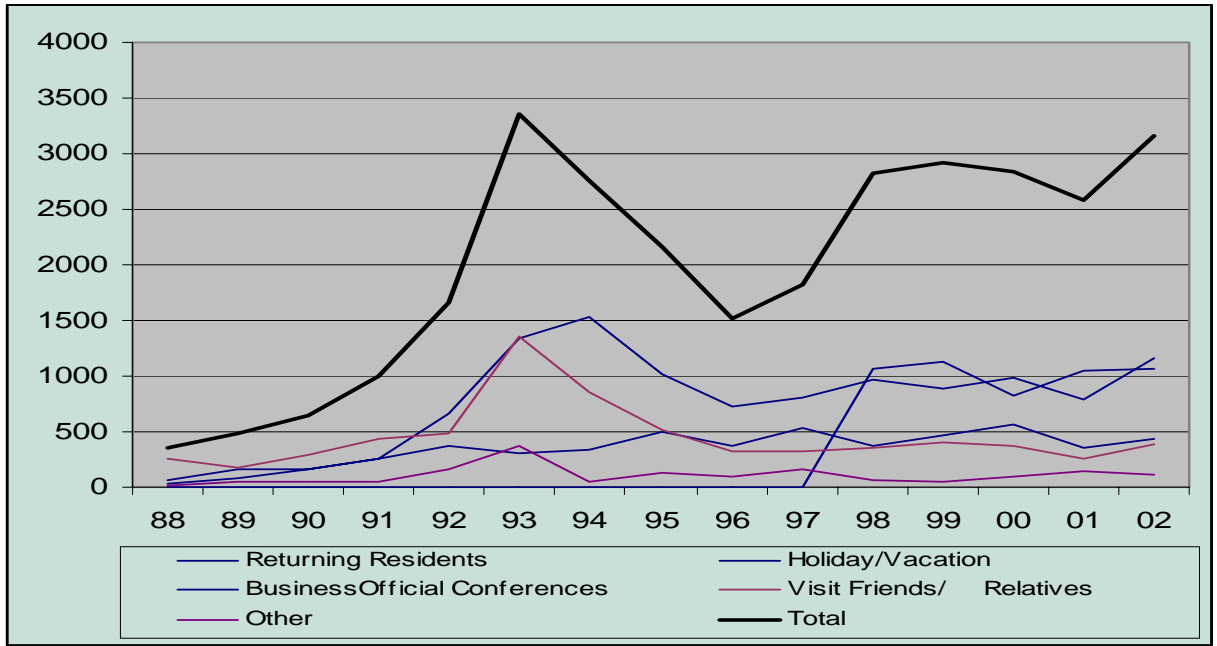

Chart 8 : Visitor Arrivals by Year and Country of Residence, 1988 - 2002

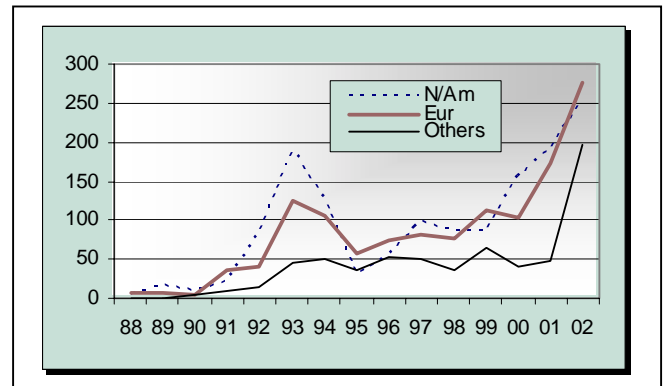
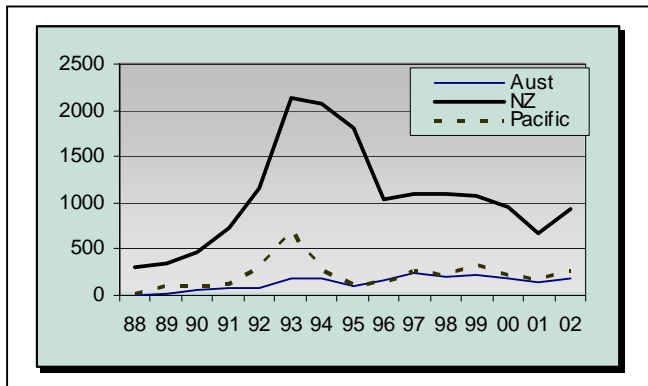
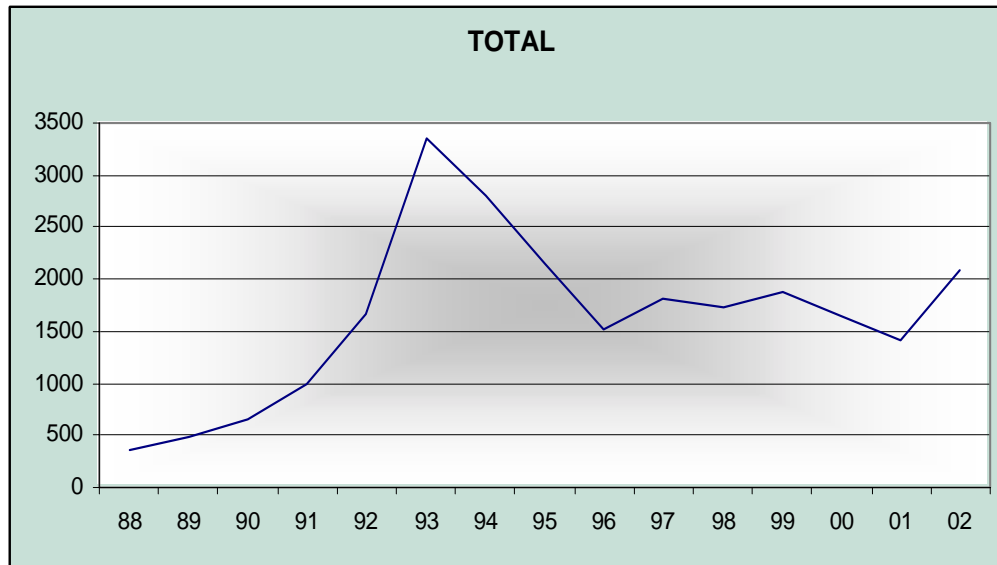

Chart 9 : Number of Occupied Houses, 1994 – 2001

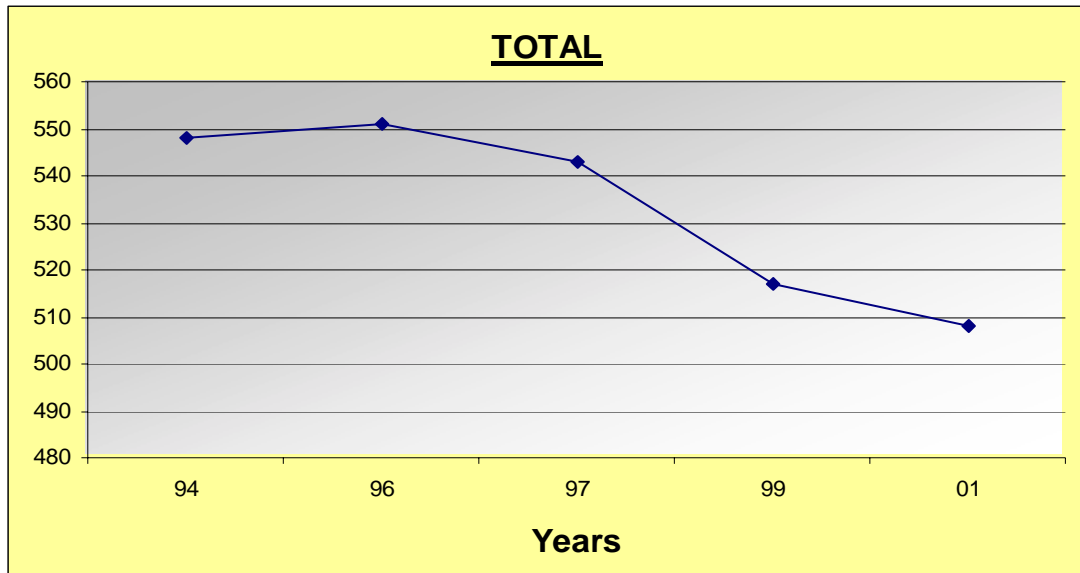


Chart 9 : Number of Occupied Houses by Villages, 1994 – 2001

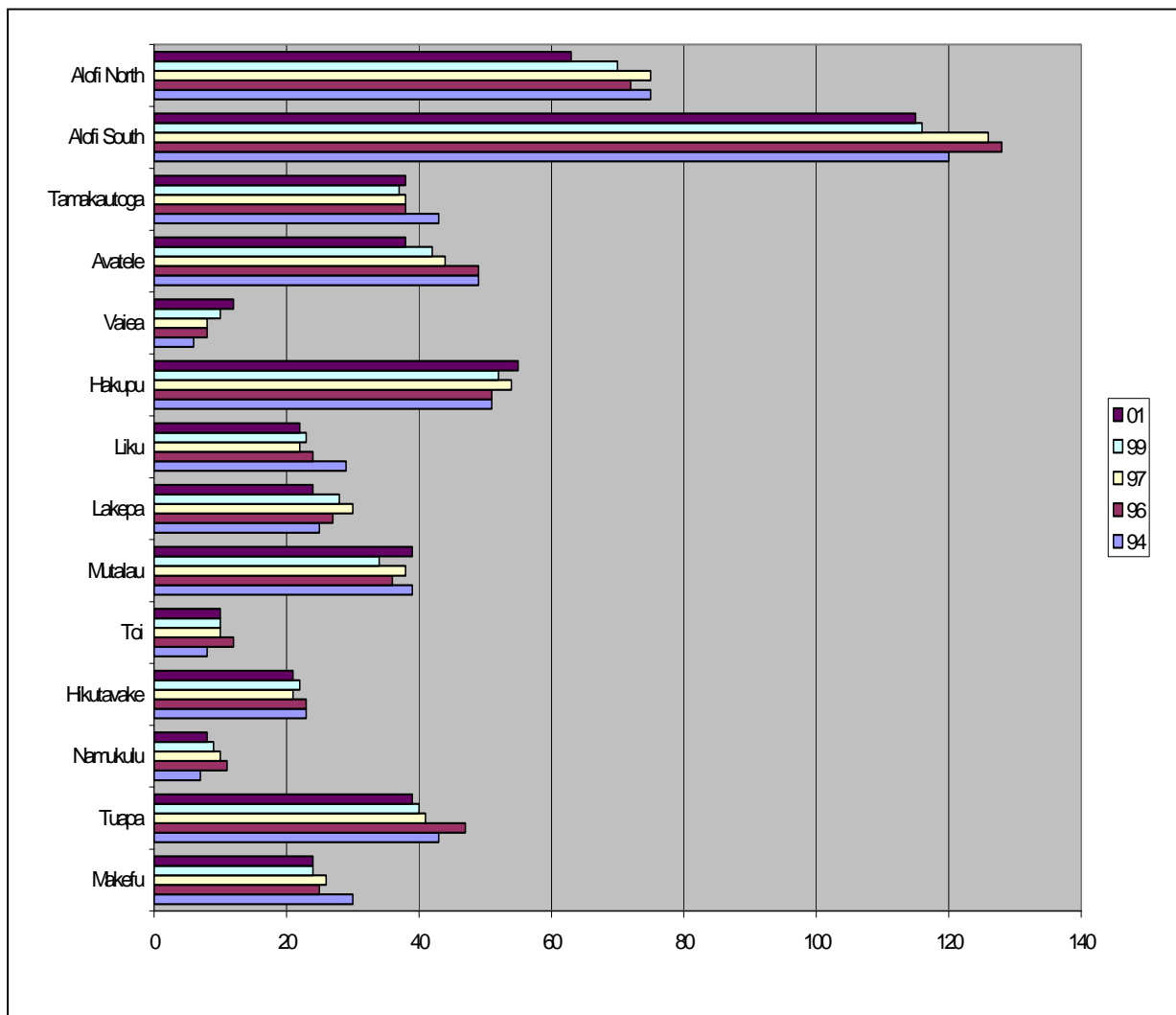

Chart 10 : Total Number of Unoccupied Houses by Village

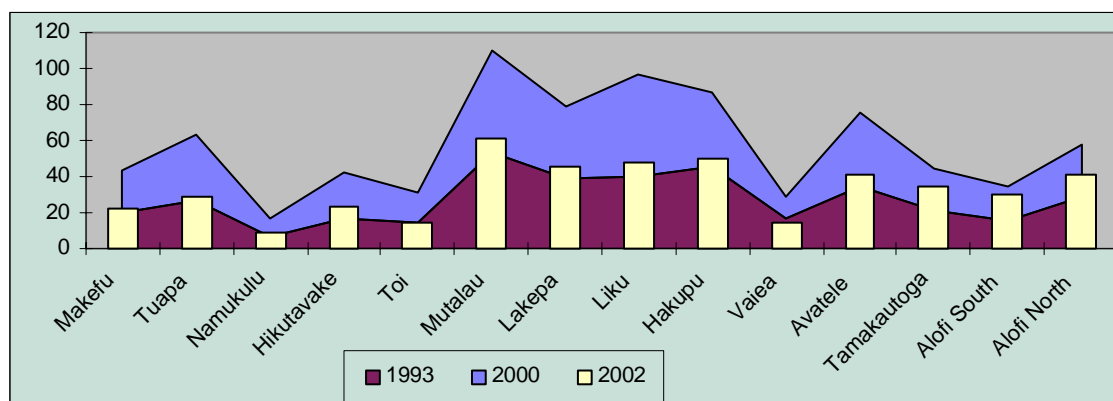

Chart 11 : Total Value of House Construction 1977 - 2002

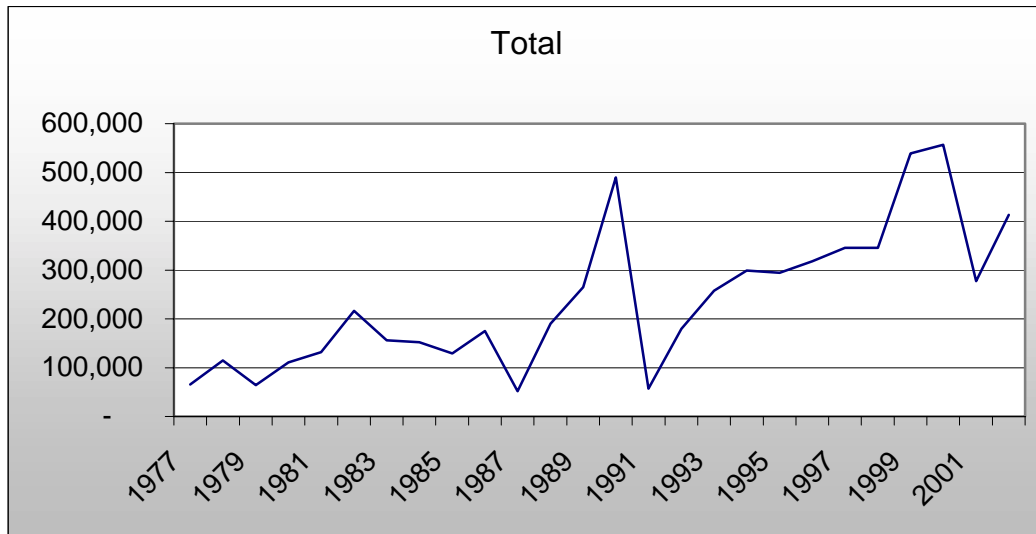


Chart 11a : Values of Construction

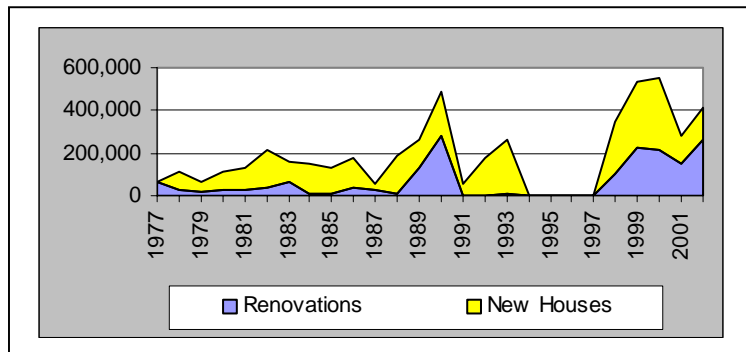


Chart 11b : Numbers of Construction

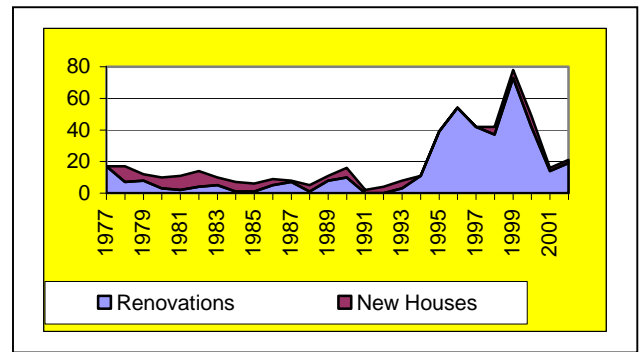

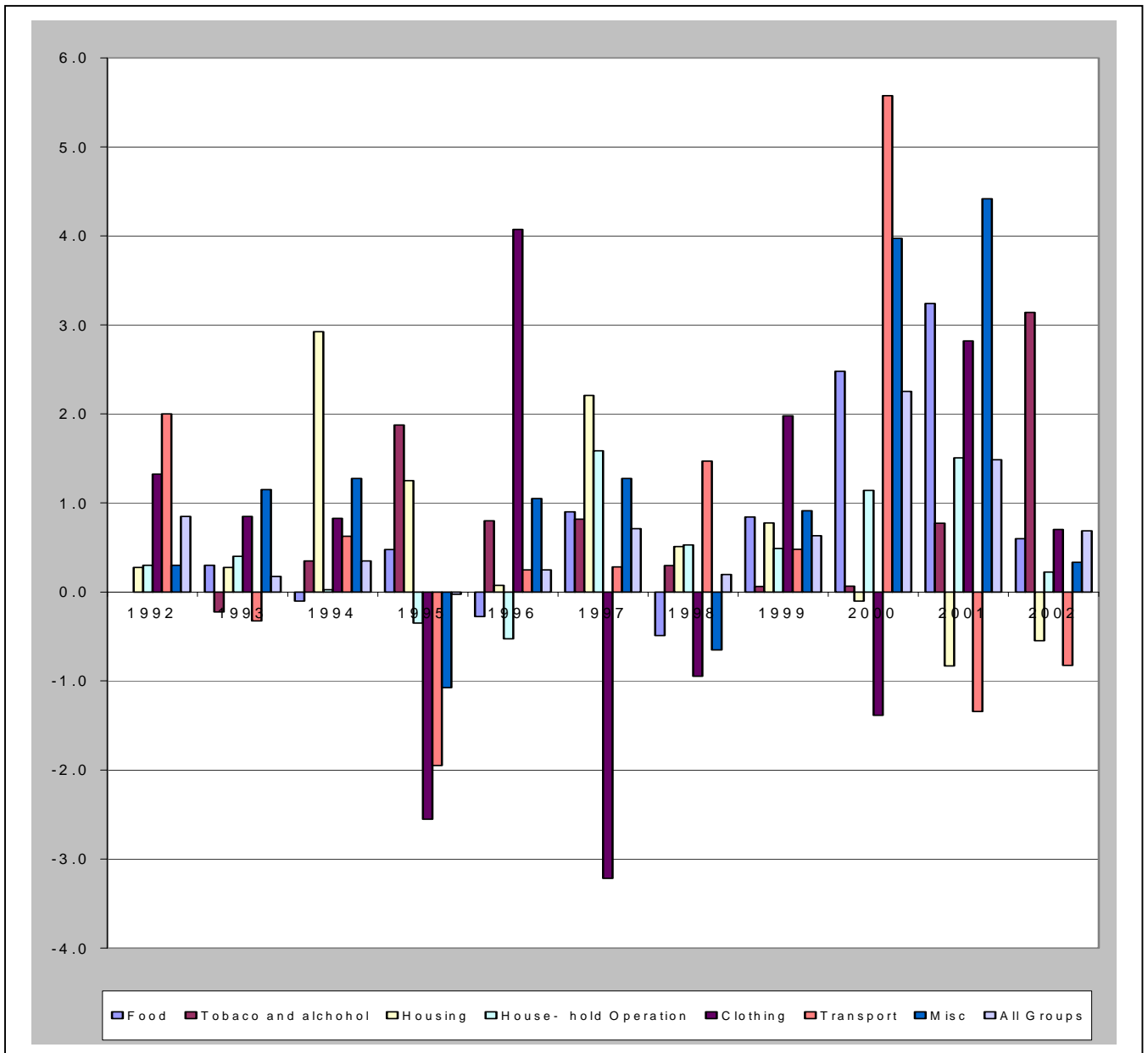

Chart 13 : Gross Domestic Product, 1997 - 2000

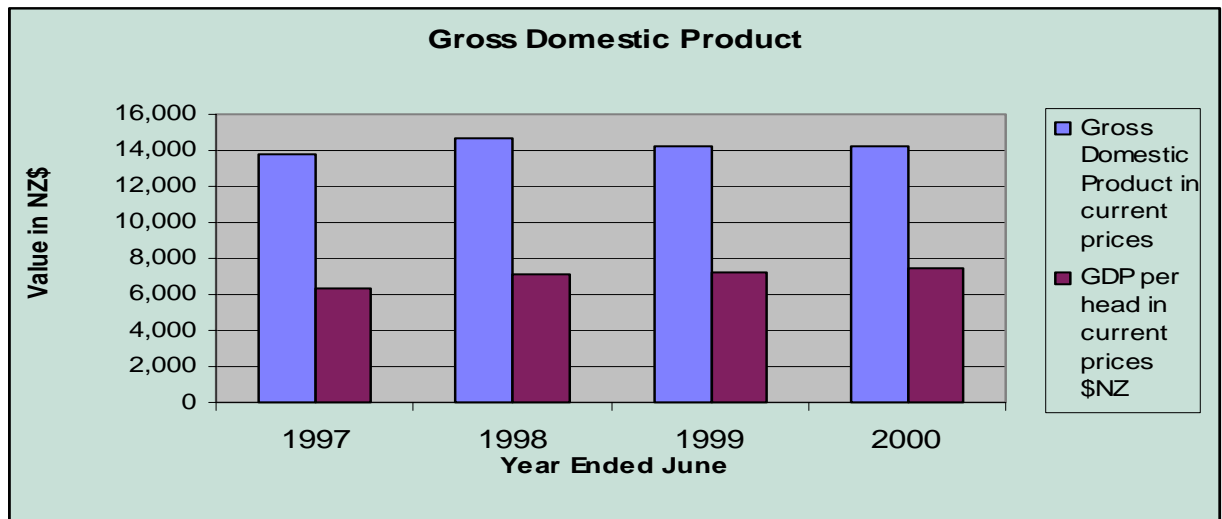

Chart 14 : Number of New Registered Vehicles

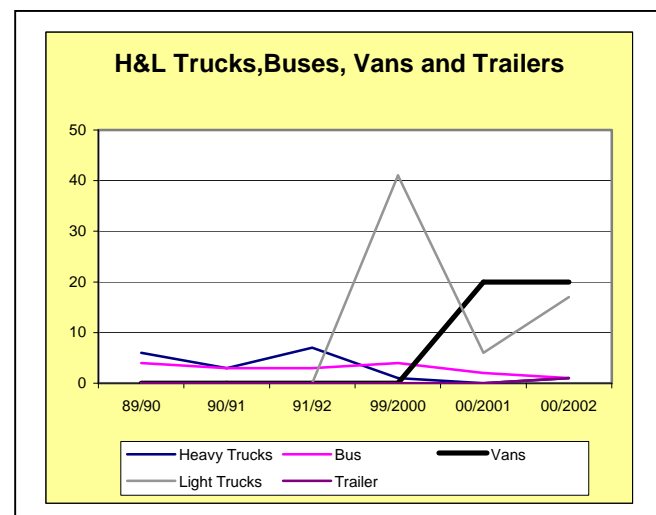
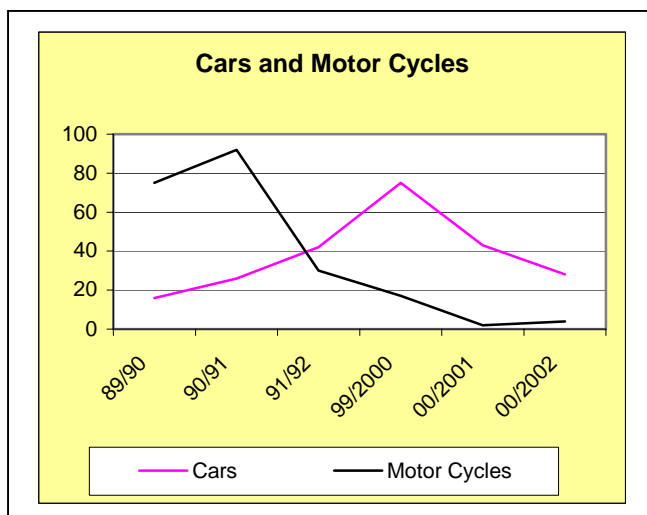

Chart 15 : Criminal Offences 1984 - 2002

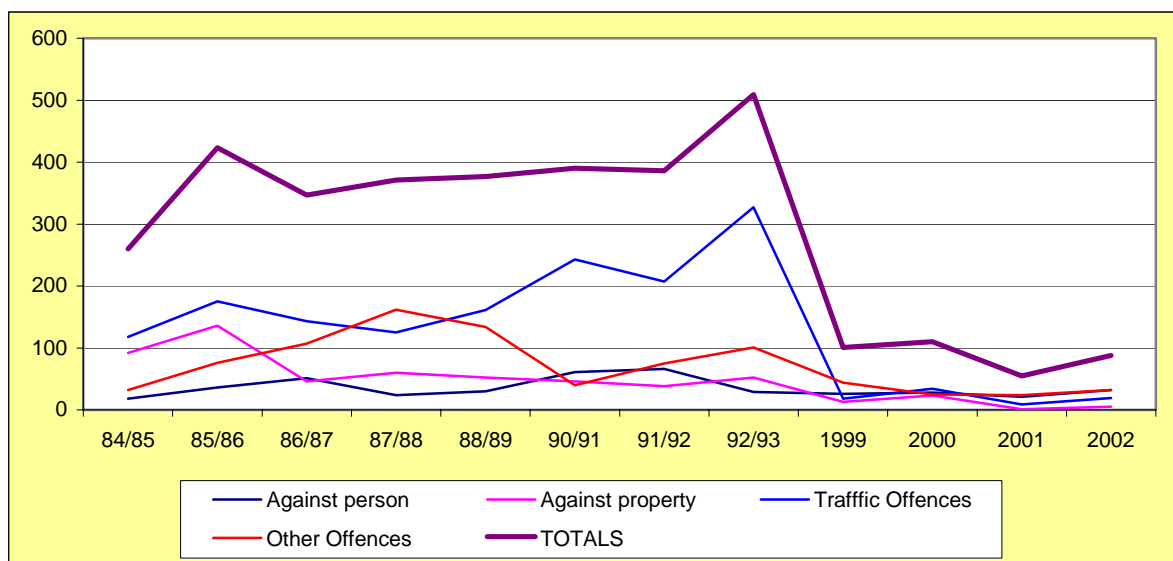

Chart 16 : Total Revenue and Expenditure

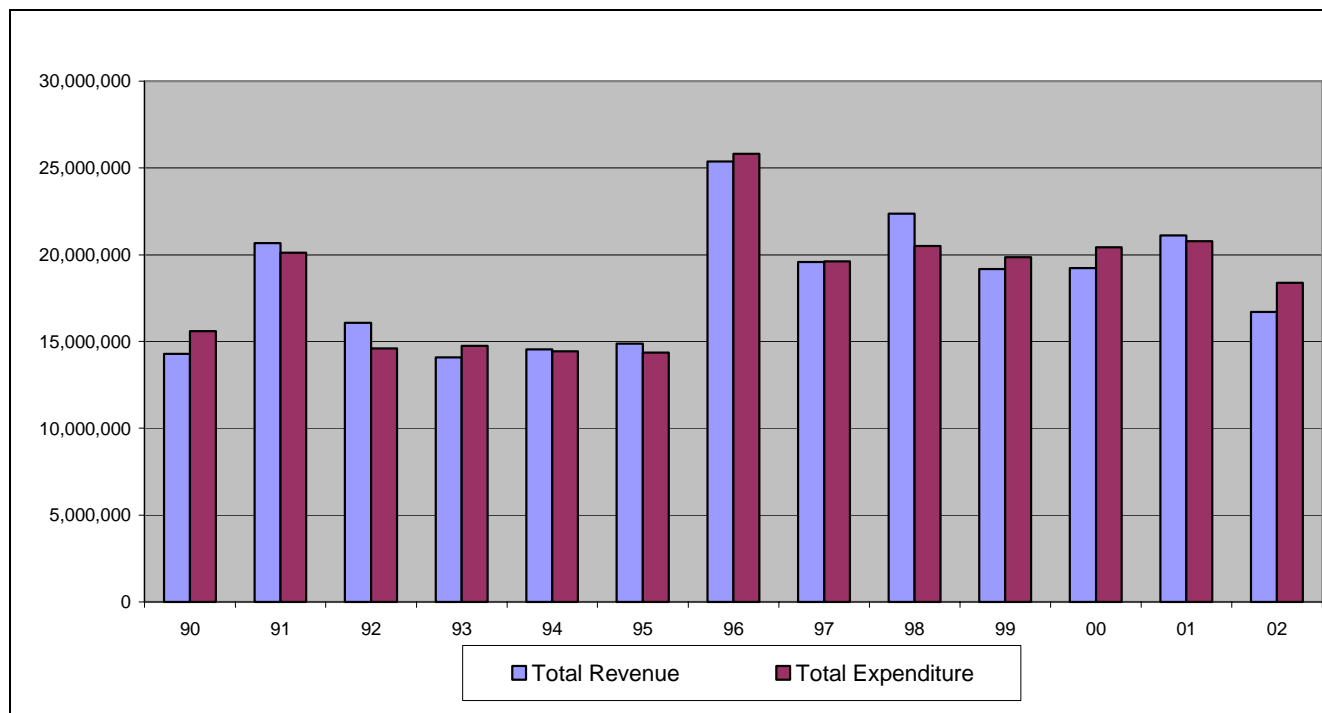

Chart 17: Total Taro Exports by Quarters 1994 – 2002 in Tonnes

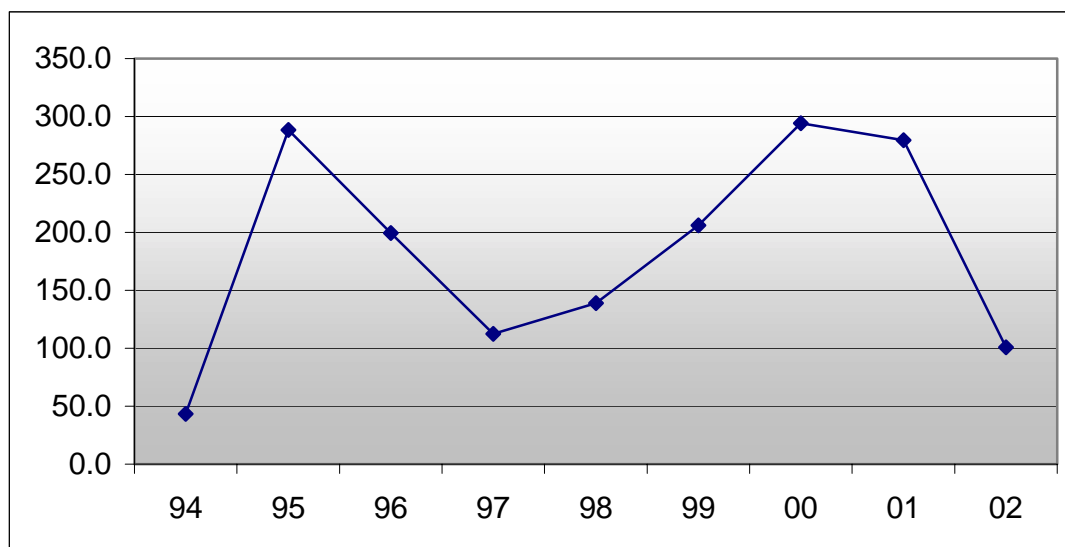
