The virtual Heads of Fisheries meeting

The twelfth Heads of Fisheries meeting will take place over **three morning sessions** – **Tues 12 to Thurs 14 May.** We have redesigned the original agenda to retain what we consider to be the most essential elements, given our experience to date with this meeting format which benefits from shorter, focused sessions. This, we hope, will make the meeting as efficient and effective as possible. However, we do plan to address items from the previous HoF12 agenda which are not included here through additional virtual sessions with HoF. These will be organised over the coming months.

The sessions for 12-14th May will be split as follows:

- 8:00-10:00 Dedicated preparation time. Members are required to use this opportunity to read the working papers (WP) and background papers (BP), presentations, and prepare comments and questions for the virtual meeting. All documents relating to the meeting (including informal papers) can be found on the meeting web page (https://fame1.spc.int/en/meetings/250), with all working papers available in English and French. The virtual meeting room will be open during this time for any questions.
- 10:00-12:30 The second part of the morning will be the virtual meeting room, using the Zoom platform. Participants can connect using the unique link sent via email, or by telephone. (The video conference link will work better if you download the Zoom application to your desktop https://zoom.us/).

Session 5: Meeting and regional mechanisms for Pacific Coastal Fisheries

Plenary discussion and decision making

Review of the Coastal Fisheries Working Group and increasing the engagement of non-state actors in Pacific Islands regional coastal fisheries mechanisms

Reference – <u>Working Paper 6</u>: Draft Report: Review of the Coastal Fisheries Working Group and options and recommendations for increasing the engagement of non-state actors in Pacific Islands' regional coastal fisheries governance. [See related PowerPoint presentation]

To facilitate the session discussions and decision-making in the short time available, we have identified some critical decision-points for the HoF that will enable the final report to be focused on the agreed mechanism. Each decision-point options will be briefly introduced by the consultant, a Zoom-based poll conducted, and a decision agreed. This assumes that everyone has read Working Paper 6, and viewed the online presentation.

The poll questions are:

Poll Q1 [Meeting format]: The consultants found agreement that there should be a two-day meeting/session focused on strengthening the consideration of priority issues in CBFM supporting strengthened NGO/CSO engagement within the regional institutional framework for fisheries. The CBFM item may be i) incorporated to the RTMCF agenda or ii) convened as a stand-alone meeting immediately prior to the RTMCF. Poll options:

- **Option 1:** A 2-day community-based fisheries management item be included in the agenda of the RTMCF, with the RTMCF extended to 5-days; or
- **Option 2:** A 2-day meeting be convened immediately before the RTMCF, focused on community-based fisheries management, that reports to the RTMCF. 2-day CBFM + 3-day RTMCF.

Poll Q2 [Chairing arrangements]: Chairing arrangements for the first CBFM meeting/RTMCF agenda item?

Option 1: SPC FAME invite a highly regarded coastal fisheries individual(s)

Option 2: HoF12 selects a chair or co-chairs

Option 3: SPC and HoF12 observers liaise post-meeting on a 'representative(s)' from the NGO community



Session 6 - Regional Technical Meeting on Coastal Fisheries (RTMCF3) Actions

Pre-meeting survey and plenary discussion

Reference – <u>Working Paper 5</u>: Report to HoF12 from the 3rd SPC Regional Technical Meeting on Coastal Fisheries. [See related PowerPoint presentation]

The purpose of this session is for the Chair of the 3rd Regional Technical Meeting on Coastal Fisheries (RTMCF3) to report on outcomes and actions from the November 2019 meeting. The RTMCF3 participants were asked to identify, discuss and agree on clear priority coastal fisheries and aquaculture technical issues and opportunities that the RTMCF3 could submit to HoF12 for consideration and action. This assumes that everyone has read Working Paper 5, and viewed the online presentation.

To facilitate the session discussions and decision-making in the short time available, we have grouped the RTMCF3 Actions into three categories:

- 1. Actions the RTMCF3 request the HoF to "note"
- 2. Actions the RTMCF3 request the HoF to "note and endorse"; and
- 3. Actions the RTMCF3 request the HoF to consider and make a determination on.

SPC has developed a <u>Survey Monkey</u> to assist with clearing the second category of actions, i.e. Actions the RTMCF3 request the HoF to "note and endorse".

HoF government members are requested to complete the Survey Monkey prior to the start of session 6 to allow the session to focus on the Actions the RTMCF3 request the HoF to consider and make a determination on.

Session 8 - Scaling-up community-based fisheries management in a COVID-19 context
