

"Leaving no-one behind"

- At least 1.5 million Pacific islanders are living with some form of disability
- Persons with disabilities in the Pacific are among the poorest and most marginalised in their communities
- They are over represented among those living in poverty and underrepresented in social, economic and public life, including in national decisionmaking



Although under the <u>Convention of The Rights for People with</u> <u>Disabilities</u> (CRPD) people with disabilities hold the same human rights as those without disabilities, all too often their access to

- education
- employment
- healthcare
- social protection is not equal



Girls and women with disabilities

 evidence shows that <u>women with disabilities</u> face unique, individualised barriers compared to both men with disabilities and non-disabled people

Perception or fact?

It is commonly assumed that there is a lack of disability data, and people attribute lack of data as the reason for failings in planning for the inclusion of people with disabilities within their programming.

It is an incorrect assumption that there is a lack of disability data.

Disability, however, is a complex phenomenon, with definitions of disability varying across contexts, as well as variations in methodologies that are employed to measure it. Therefore, the body of disability data that does exist is not comprehensive, is often of low quality, and is lacking in comparability
