
Results Summary 2018

Each year, as part of SPC's organisation-wide annual results reporting process, SPC collates the results achieved in each of its member countries and territories, and in the region. In 2018, 588 results were reported across the organisation towards the achievement of our objectives. Of these results, 8 country-specific results were reported for Cook Islands, with an additional 23 multi-country results benefitting Cook Islands.

The highest number of results supported SDG 14: Life below water followed by SDG 16: Peace, justice and strong institutions. One result may contribute to multiple SDGs.
