
Results Summary 2018

Each year, as part of SPC's organisation-wide annual results reporting process, SPC collates the results achieved in each of its member countries and territories, and in the region. In 2018, 588 results were reported across the organisation towards the achievement of our objectives. Of these results, six country-specific results were reported for Niue, with an additional 10 multi-country results benefitting Niue.

SPC's staff supported Niue in achieving its results in four ways:




SPC's contribution to the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals

In 2018, we mapped each result to the SDGs to show how SPC contributes to their achievement in each of our member countries and territories. In Niue, results contributed to 10 of the 17 SDGs. The highest number of results supported SDG 3: Good health and well-being, followed by SDG 14: Life below water. One result may contribute to multiple SDGs.

First 'Tails' logsheet was entered in 2016. There are now nearly 100 data collectors operating in 10 PICTs, with 451 unique species logged, and 564,092 kg of fish recorded.
