













































Dynamite fishing is bad beacuse:

- 1. It kills baby fish as well as bigger fish that have not yet made babies
- It also kills or harms other sea animals like sea turtles, dugongs, sea cucumbers and lobsters
- 3. It destroys the coral homes where fish, lobsters and other sea animals live
- 4. It can kill or injure humans who use it
- 5. It is against the law,

What to do when you see someone using dynamite:

- 1. Talk to the person and explain that dynamite fishing is destructive
- Report the person to the village Fishing Management Committee, or to the village elders
- Tell other people in the village that this person is destroying their fishing grounds
- Organize a village meeting to discuss what should be done about people using dynamite.
