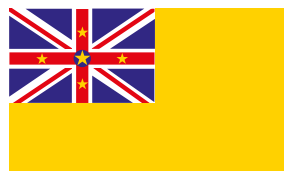




Summary of the Pacific Community's 2015 work programme in
